- 4. What public financing solution/solutions in health could be best utilised to help generate a sustainable medicines financing system e.g. increased funding, ring-fenced/hypothecated tax for medicines, general health tax.
- 5. Can any private financing solutions (e.g. insurance, co-funding (philanthropy, out of pocket payments)) be better employed in New Zealand , if so how ?
